英語圏の大学で教育を受けるのに十分な英語力を身につけることを目標とし、英語による口頭表現能力向上のための訓練を短期集中で行います。この授業は「英語スピーキング演習 G I 」(学士課程の学生対象)という 100 番台の英語選択科目で、各 2 単位を取得できます。

Overall Course Objectives

The objective of this short-term intensive program is to train students in such a way as to increase their abilities in English oral expression, to the point where they can participate in tertiary education in the English-speaking world. The class has the overall title "Oral Expression in English G I", and is directed at undergraduates. This is an English elective subject, and participants are eligible to receive 2 units of credit.

- Course Description: This four-day intensive course is aimed at students interested in having the opportunity to speak English and improve their critical thinking and oral expression skills while discussing a variety of topics which are pertinent to their daily lives. The main topics likely to be discussed will include travel, health, climate/environment and technology and society. Classes will be discussion based, and will lead to a pair work project in which students are responsible for creating a PSA (public service announcement) on a topic of their choice. Active participation by all students is expected.

- Evaluation: 50% Attendance and class participation and 50% Project presentations

• Course Description: During this course, we will be exploring some techniques to help students with their future pursuits overseas; whether considering science-related subjects abroad, attending a language school to improve English skills or applying for an internship, this course is designed to help students to become a more confident writer and speaker. These classes will recreate the atmosphere of an authentic study abroad community. Students are advised to speak English as much as possible, to respect classmates by listening to them carefully and helping them when they have problems. By the end of the course, students will have prepared an interview, a statement of purpose and a short presentation related to studying overseas.

- **Evaluation:** One 500-word Statement of Purpose: 50%, One short presentation: 25%, One-page feedback on interviews: 25%

The course is titled "Oral Expression in English GIA", and is directed at undergraduate students. This is an English elective subject, and participants are eligible to receive 2 units of credit.

Course Requirements and Application (Undergraduates)

- 1. 20 students in each class. Places are assigned on a first-come-first-served basis.
- 2. Students are required to attend all dates.
- 3. For students who begin their degree in or after April 2024, the credits in these courses will be counted as partial fulfillment of the requirements for the completion of the Global Education Option (GEO) of the Entrepreneurship Education. Students planning to pursue the GEO track are advised to take one of these courses.
- 4. You may not enroll in multiple "Oral Expression in English G I" classes. The permissible combination is as follows: One class from the three IOO-leve "Oral Expression in English G I" + one class from the 300-level "Oral Expression in English G I A."
- 5. All three "Oral Expression in English G I" classes have the same level of difficulty.
- 6. Students who have previously taken and earned credits for "Oral Expression in English G I " or "Oral Expression in English G I A " are not permitted to retake the course for credit. However, they may attend the course as auditors (without credit).
- 7. Students with IDs beginning with 24B (except for GSEP and credit students) may not enroll in the 300-level "Oral Expression in English G I A."
- 8. Graduate students can take undergraduate courses and earn credits but they are not included in graduate school requirements. Please take "Oral Expression in English GII" for graduates.
- 9. Students who are planning to graduate in September 2024 will not be able to receive credits for this course in time for the graduation decision deadline.
- 10. Students who register/add to the course via the Kyomu Web System but do not complete the Google Form application will not be able to take the course.
